Temperament has a strong stability and exhibits early performance. The most important point is that personality can be divided into good and bad, but temperament is not divided into good and bad.

3. Specific types and characteristics of temperament classification

The classification and characteristics of temperament research have been defined differently by many scholars, which has laid a good foundation for future generations to study this content and provided a rich reference. In the formation of the theory of temperament, future generations have the highest degree of acceptance and development, and the most far-reaching impact so far was proposed by a doctor named Hippocrates in ancient Greece. He pointed out from the physiological level that there are four different liquids in the human body, namely blood, mucus, yellow bile, and black bile. From the name, it can be observed that the type of depressive temperament is mainly represented by the image of Lin Daiyu. Therefore, they are often prone to thinking excessively and influenced by others' behavior, so they can detect places that others cannot feel when facing problems.
